Dear Sir,

Due to the fact that Estrela report remains on the agenda for the next December Plenary session it is essential to emphasize, that the administration did not release the motion for a resolution on time. MEP need to decide on a text which is not published yet. Some informal communications on the exact contents of the report must not be a ground for any formal steps that MEPs would be interested in undertaking.

These are unacceptable conditions for EU lawmakers. In particular, Members does not have time to study the text properly and table amendments to the Plenary. Our correspondence shows us, that Members of the EP are highly dissatisfied and consider themselves being misinformed. Their constant complaining on the procedure is in this context highly justified.

According to our information, also the EP legal service has already heavily objected the procedural errors of the responsible FEMM committee. It is clear to us, that such a vulnerable topic, as reproductive health is, must not be proceeded in this way. According to these facts it is strictly necessary and justified to postpone the vote of the Estrela report in the Plenary.
